
Writing a CV

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Opening up the GMC online application

- Online guide that directs step wise
- Payment not required to start the process
- Application in the portal can be maintained for up to a year
- Evidence uploaded becomes read only



Structured reports from referees

Triangulation
Accuracy
Anonymisation

Finalisation of the evidence and verification process

Feedback report from Specialist registry advisor

Submission of additional evidence with further proformas

Hindrance

- Technical discrepancies in grouping the evidence: GMC online application domain/ SSG/ proforma format
- Identifying the evidence that warrants verification
- Bottle neck of upper limit of file/ item numbers and page limit
- Absolute permanent redaction of patient identification details, staff details in selected instances
- Dates in employment letters/ CV/ application should match.
- Translation of languages other than English
- Authentication process

Grey areas

• Verifiers versus referees' roles

• The extent and depth of evidence

 Overlap between certain types of evidence eg- summary list/ caseload statistics/ patient lists

Must have versus good to have

- Work based assessments
- Curriculum competency ratings
- Patient survey forms
- MSFs
- Testimonials
- Reflective diary including experience in patient complaints/ Al
- Clinical governance
