Travel and Cannula Change Information

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Key considerations:

- Travel insurance: always declare diabetes as a pre-existing condition and list all medications.
- Take a copy of your repeat prescription with you
- Travel letters / Medical awareness cards: company or clinical team https://www.caa.co.uk/media/4f1pswv0/caa aoa medicaldeviceawarenesscard.pdf
- Pack more than you would normally need: Insulin and consumables – remember to pack it in hand luggage; including emergency kit
- Consider taking snacks / hypo PX consider flight delays /access to treatments. Foot care
- Consider using disability lanyards: customer services, some shops like M&S, Tesco,



Navigating airport Security with advanced technologies

- CGM and insulin pump manufacturers have their own guidance on which devices can go through metal detectors, x-rays and full body scanners.
- You can ask a security agent for an alternative method of screening (e.g. pat-down) or wand scanner.
- Usually scanning arch way is ok but avoid anywhere where it indicated no pacemaker or high magnetic field.
- If the only way through security is through a scanner, you can request that it is switched off.



Insulin Pumps

- If you are on **insulin pump therapy**, travel between different time zones becomes much easier.
- You should wait until you land in the country then change to local time.
- Consider switching your pump to flight mode during take off, flight and landing. (some systems) Be aware that insulin delivery can be effected on take off and landing due to altered pressure and possible purge and ease off in insulin delivery.
- Consider a loan insulin pump (sometimes need six week notice).
- Caution with sunlight and heat. Remember: insulin degrades quicker in heat and the integrity of the pump casing and workings may be effected in extreme heat changes
- Remember activity levels
