- 13428 pump users (c6% of type 1 population)
- Completed clinical data on 6221- 46%
- Anecdotally data useful





Sex Distribution




Age Distribution




In 2014-15, the proportion of people with Type 1 diabetes attending participating specialist services and treated with an insulin pump is 12.2 per cent




Mean HbA1c




